1493 – Pope Alexander VI issued a papal bull dividing the New World between Spain and Portugal and forbidding further exploration.

1836 – The “Iron Kitten,” Canada’s first railway locomotive, was purchased by the Champlain and St. Lawrence Railroad.

1953 – Ernest Hemingway won the Pulitzer Prize for *The Old Man and the Sea*. The novel’s epic battle between an experienced fisherman and a large marlin was compared to Herman Melville’s *Moby-Dick*.

1973 – The Anglican Church of Canada passed a resolution to allow women to become ordained ministers.
