1429 – The six-month Siege of Orléans ended when French troops led by 17-year-old Joan of Arc drove the English from the city.

1978 – Reinhold Messner and Peter Habeler reached the summit of Mount Everest. They were the first men known to climb Everest without the use of oxygen tanks.

Ricky Nelson (1940–1985) was an American singer, songwriter, and actor known for being a teen idol

in the 1950s. With hits like "Travelin' Man," "Hello Mary Lou," and "Poor Little Fool," Nelson became a charttopping sensation,



leaving an indelible mark on early rock and roll. Ricky's transition from a family sitcom (*The Adventures of Ozzie and Harriet*) to a successful music career was seamless. His smooth voice and charismatic stage presence defined an era, influencing future generations of musicians. Tragically, Nelson died in a plane crash on New Year's Eve 1985.
