### The Position

The Alzheimer Society of Alberta and Northwest Territories is seeking a full-time temporary Specialist, Palliative Approach and Grief Programs who will act as a key member of the Client Services Team. Working collaboratively with the Manager, Palliative and Grief this position will design, implement, and deliver specialized programs and resources that support individuals living with dementia and their care partners. This includes educational content development, program activities, and program delivery. The Specialist will focus on emotional, psychosocial, and practical support, ensuring individuals and families receive holistic, compassionate, and culturally responsive care throughout their dementia experience.

This role is suitable for a Registered Social Worker, Allied Health Professional under a managed body, or Registered Nurse with expertise in dementia care, grief training, and palliative approaches.

This is a term position until June 30, 2027, with the possibility of extension and/or permanency. The primary deliverables of this position include:

- Developing and facilitating grief education programs and peer support groups.
- Providing supports to families at key transitions in care, including hospice or long-term care placements.
- Developing pathways for grief, community and mindfulness resource support and needs identification of clients.



- Collaborating with community organizations and healthcare professionals to enhance palliative and grief supports.
- Ensuring program(s) are consistently delivered, using various delivery methods, and responding to the primary target groups' needs.

# Qualifications

- Registered Social Worker (RSW), Registered Nurse (RN), or an Allied Health Professional in a registered body with relevant experience in dementia, grief, and palliative care.
- Minimum of 3 years supporting individuals with dementia and their care partners in a healthcare, social work, or community setting.
- Demonstrated knowledge of grief processes, anticipatory grief, and palliative approaches in dementia care.
- Experience facilitating support groups, therapeutic support, and delivering education sessions.
- Familiarity with healthcare navigation, advance care planning, and dementia-related resources.
- Compassionate, person-centered approach to care.
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills, with the ability to provide emotional support to individuals and families.
- Knowledge of cultural humility and trauma-informed care principles.
- Proficiency in virtual service delivery (e.g., webinars, online counseling, telehealth).
- Willingness to travel within Alberta as needed.
