Getting Started - How to Organize your Event



REGISTER YOUR EVENT

Contact us at events@alzheimernb.ca or (506) 800-3149 to register your event. We will need to know your contact information, as well as what type of event you'd like to host and when you'll be hosting it.



PROMOTE YOUR EVENT

Share photos and videos across your social media channels with captions that explain your event. Depending on the type of event you are organizing, consider creating an event page on Facebook and adding the Alzheimer Society of NB as a co-host!

Be sure to tag the Alzheimer Society of NB with @AlzheimerNB and #AnythingforAlzheimers so we can see your posts!



POSTERS

You can create your own poster for your event, or use the template attached to this guide (Appendix A). It is important to use the ASNB logo in accordance with our brand standards. If you would like to add our logo to your materials, it must be approved by a representative of the Alzheimer Society of New Brunswick before distributing.



USE VIDEO CONFERENCING

Bring your event attendees together to enjoy your fundraising activity via video on Facebook, Instagram, Zoom, or Skype. See our how-to guide for step-by-step instructions on these video conferencing platforms (Appendix B).



How can I get involved?

You can do Anything for Alzheimer's by taking your own unique idea and turning it into an event. If you aren't sure where to start, check out the list of FUNdraiser ideas below! Be sure to take advantage of online and virtual options.

ONLINE TRIVIA OR GAME NIGHT

Get your friends together for some trivia or a game night! There are lots of great virtual options to play online.

GET MOVING

Commit to walking, hiking, jogging or running to raise funds. Ask your family and friends to make a pledge per km completed.

VIRTUAL TALENT SHOW OR CONCERT

Go live on Facebook and share your talent, whether it be singing, playing an instrument, dancing, or telling jokes!



ARTS AND CRAFTS

Put your talent to work and make crafts or other items to raise funds!

CELEBRATION

Do you have a special day coming up, like a birthday or anniversary? Consider asking for donations instead of gifts!



DENIM DAY

Get your co-workers involved and hold a casual day at your office. You can ask to host the activity and collect the proceeds.

SPRING CLEANING IN THE FALL

Looking to lighten your load and do some purging? Consider a socially-distanced yard sale or selling your items on Facebook.

ONLINE YOGA CLASS

Invite your friends to get zen for a good cause and teach them some of your favourite yoga poses.

NIGHT OF THE ARTS

If you are an author or poet, consider doing a reading of your work.

VIRTUAL COOKING LESSON

If you like to cook, offer to teach your friends how to cook a nice meal.

SUBMIT YOUR DONATION

If you've collected bills and coins please tally and deposit the cash, then write a cheque to the Alzheimer Society of NB for the total amount and mail it to our provincial office within 30 days of your event. Remember to include a note with your name and the name of your fundraising event so we know the donation has come from you. Please do not mail cash; we recommend sending a cheque or money order instead.

TAX RECEIPTS

Tax receipts are issued for donations of \$10 or more, please keep track of names, addresses, and amounts (see Appendix C for donation sheet). To be eligible for a tax receipt, the donor must not have purchased a good or service in accordance with CRA regulations.


Ensure you are:

How to: Video Tools

Online video platforms are a great way to get your event attendees together virtually and to create a social atmosphere while enjoying your fundraising activity. Take a look through the below steps to learn about different platforms and make your virtual fundraiser a success.

HOW TO: GENERAL VIDEOS TIPS

1. Tell family and friends the date and time of your virtual event in advance so they know when to tune in.
2. Set your camera's orientation, pick a quiet spot with good lighting and a strong internet connection.
3. Record a test clip to ensure you have a good setting before you start streaming.
4. During the call, interact with viewers, explain why you're fundraising and ask people to donate.
5. Remember to thank your audience at the end of your event!

HOW TO: LIVE STREAM



FACEBOOK

1. Go to the camera option on Facebook and switch to "Live" on the bottom of your screen. Give your camera and microphone access and check your privacy and posting settings.
2. Write a compelling description about why you are supporting the Alzheimer Society of N.B. and include your event name and details on how to donate.
3. Add extras: tag friends, choose your location, add filters or writing and drawing.
4. Click the blue "Start live demo" button to start broadcasting your activity.
5. Click "Finish" to end your stream. The live stream will be automatically saved to your timeline.



INSTAGRAM

1. Open the mobile Instagram app to begin your live stream. Remember you cannot post to Instagram from your browser so this needs to be done via your mobile app.
2. Select the camera icon in the top left corner.
3. There is a menu that scrolls horizontally at the bottom of the screen; select "Live."
4. The shutter button will change to a broadcast icon. Tap it to go live.
5. Click "End" to end your stream. You can save it to your stories for 24 hours, delete or download it.



HOW TO: ZOOM

Set up an account: Host up to 100 participants for 40 minutes at a time when you set up a free Zoom account.

1. Go to <http://zoom.us> and click on “Sign up” or “Sign in” if you already have an account or go to the desktop app if you have it downloaded.
2. Register or enter your login details. You can also use your Google or Facebook account to sign in.
3. Click on “Host a meeting” on the web, or on “New meeting” on the desktop app.
4. Select “Call using internet audio.” Once in the call, make sure neither “Mute” or “Stop video” are selected if you want people to see and hear you.
5. Click “Security” to check your security measures. Make sure that “Enable waiting room” is switched on so you can screen who enters your call.
6. To invite people, click “Participants” and “Invite.” You can choose to send an email to participants or a direct invite to your Zoom contacts. Alternatively, choose “Copy URL” to share and send it via WhatsApp.
7. When your invitees click the link, they will arrive in the Waiting Room. Press “Manage participants” to let them access the call. You can also turn on the “Play chime for enter/exit” in Settings so you know when someone is trying to access the call.
8. When all participants are on the call, select “Lock meeting” to allow no more participants in.

SCHEDULE A CALL

1. Log in and click “Schedule” instead of starting a meeting. You will see a menu of settings which can be tweaked. The default security settings will be turned on, so the main thing to do is pick a time.
2. Once you select “Schedule” or “Done,” you will see a box with a big chunk of text, or a calendar event on mobile. That can then be copied and shared.
3. When you want to start the meeting, go to “Meetings” in your app and select start.

JOIN A CALL

If joining someone else’s Zoom call, the call Host should give you the meeting ID and password.

1. Open Zoom and click “Join a Meeting” to join without signing in or sign in and click “Join.”
2. Enter the meeting ID number and password.
3. Select if you would like to connect audio and/or video and click “Join” to enter the call.

HOW TO: SKYPE

Set up a video call: Calling Skype contacts who are using the Skype app is free but calling a mobile phone or landline through Skype requires Skype Credit or a subscription.

1. Find the person you want to call from your Contacts list.
2. Select the contact you want to call, and then select the audio call button, or video call button to make it a video call. If you want to make a group call, simply add the other participants.
3. At the end of a call, select the end call button to hang up.

HOW TO: FACETIME

1. Open the FaceTime app on your iOS device and click the “+” icon in the top-right corner.
2. Type in the names or numbers of the people you'd like to talk to. If they're in your contact list, their names will come up as you type, and you can click on each name to add them to the call. You can also click on the circle with a “+” inside it to open your contacts list and select people from there. Tap their name to open the contact, then tap their number to add them.
3. Tap the green video button to start a video call or the audio button to start an audio call.
