Moe Howard (1897–1975), who was born Moses Horowitz, was an American comedian and actor best known as the hilarious kingpin of the Three Stooges comedy act, alongside Larry Fine, his brother Curly Howard, and others. The

masters of farce and slapstick performed on the vaudeville circuit as well as in numerous film and television projects over 40 years. His trademark bowl cut



hairstyle came about from cutting his own hair after being bullied in grade school for sporting the longer locks his mother preferred. Howard left high school to pursue acting, starting out with bit parts and then finding success in vaudeville and, eventually, the movies.

Garden Party

Tuscany's Il Giardino dei Tarocchi, or Tarot Garden, is a massive sculpture park and garden dedicated to the tarot deck of cards. It was created by artist Niki de Saint Phalle, and is the first such garden created entirely by a woman. Inspired by Gaudi's gardens in Barcelona, de Saint Phalle wanted to build one herself. She constructed 22 massive and fanciful sculptures out of concrete and covered them in mirrors and colorful mosaic, representing tarot figures, including the Sphinx, Magician, and High Priestess.
