1837 — Queen Victoria ascended the British throne at age 18 after the death of her uncle, William IV.

Martin Landau (1928–2017) was



an American actor, popular in the late 1950s and beyond, who also worked as an acting coach and cartoonist. He learned his craft

alongside James Dean at Manhattan's Actors Studio. Landau's films include North by Northwest with Cary Grant, Cleopatra, Crimes and Misdemeanors, City Hall, and Rounders. He won a Best Supporting Actor Oscar for 1994's Ed Wood and a Golden Globe for his role in Francis Ford Coppola's Tucker: The Man and His Dream. He's also remembered for his supporting role on the popular secret agent television show Mission: Impossible.

The Games People Play

Children's author A. A. Milne, creator of Winnie-the-Pooh, also created the game known as "Poohsticks," which



was first played by Winniethe-Pooh and his friends in the book *The House at Pooh Corner*. The unpretentious sport requires

a bridge over water. Players find sticks and drop them over one side of the bridge into the stream below. They then rush to the other side of the bridge and see which stick is the first to appear. Interestingly, many people make the pilgrimage to the bridge in Ashdown Forest, East Sussex, where Pooh first played Poohsticks.
