Eye in the Sky

The planet Upsilon Andromedae b, also known as Saffar, is called "the





planet of fire and ice" for good reason. This giant planet lies

44 light-years away from our solar system. The sunlit side of the planet is 3,000 degrees Fahrenheit, hotter than the hottest lava. In contrast, the dark side of the sphere is a freezing -4 degrees. Scientists believe that the dramatic temperature range is due to the orb's proximity to its star, to which it is tidally locked. This means that the planet does not revolve but remains facing its sun in a tight orbit that lasts just 4.6 days.
