1939 – Legendary crooner Frank Sinatra recorded his first single, "From the Bottom of My Heart," backed by



trumpeter Harry James. Although not a major hit at the time, it remains a notable milestone in Sinatra's career.

1953 – The Stratford Festival in Stratford, Ontario, debuted its first season. Conceived by local resident Tom Patterson, the festival began under a big-top tent with a production of Shakespeare's *Richard III* starring Alec Guinness.

1985 – The LiveAid benefit concert was held simultaneously at Wembley Stadium in London and JFK Stadium in Philadelphia to raise funds for famine relief in Ethiopia. It featured performances by iconic artists like Queen, U2, Madonna, and Elton John.

advocacy work, including supporting domestic violence charities and promoting animal welfare. He resides in England with his wife, accomplished

singer-songwriter Sunny Ozell.
