1954 – On the Waterfront, directed by Elia Kazan and starring Marlon Brando, premiered in theaters. This gripping crime drama set in Hoboken, New Jersey, went on to win eight Academy Awards, including Best Picture and Best Actor for Brando.

1967 – Ten Torontonians with shared West Indian heritage established the Caribana cultural festival. Now known as the Toronto Caribbean Carnival, the festival showcases vibrant Caribbean culture through music, dance, and colorful parades.

1991 – Miguel Induráin, a Spanish cyclist known for his exceptional endurance and time-trialing skills, claimed his first Tour de France victory. The triumph marked the beginning of an extraordinary streak, as Induráin went on to win the prestigious race five consecutive times.

Happy Birthday!

Terry Fox (1958–1981) was a young Canadian athlete who changed the world with his determined spirit in the face of adversity. Diagnosed with

osteosarcoma at age 18, he faced the amputation of his right leg above the knee. Refusing to let this define him, Fox conceived a bold and



selfless mission: to run across Canada to raise money and awareness for cancer research. He named it the "Marathon of Hope." He began in April 1980 and ran an average of 42 kilometers each day for 143 days, inspiring Canadians from coast to coast. Sadly, Fox was forced to stop when cancer spread to his lungs. He died on June 28, but his remarkable legacy endures. To date, the annual Terry Fox Run has raised more than \$900 million for cancer research.
