## On This Date

**1955** – A record 65 million viewers tuned into NBC’s live broadcast of the musical *Peter Pan* starring Mary Martin. It was the first time a full-length Broadway show had been broadcast on color TV.



**1982** – The NCAA Tournament Selection Show was televised live on CBS for the first time. Schools, players, and fans across the country learned simultaneously whether their teams had made the field, adding an exhilarating element to the tournament.

**1984** – Research in Motion (RIM)—the company that would later become BlackBerry—was founded in Waterloo, Ontario. Created by engineering students Mike Lazaridis and Douglas Fregin, the company began as a small electronics and computer science consulting firm.



## Happy Birthday!

**Paddy Clancy** (1922–1998) was a prominent Irish folk singer and a member of the Clancy Brothers, one of the most influential groups in the folk music revival.



Born in Carrick-on-Suir, Ireland, Paddy emigrated to the United States, where he and his brothers—Tom, Liam, and Bobby—joined forces with Tommy Makem to bring traditional Irish folk music to international audiences. With their stirring harmonies, spirited performances, and Aran sweaters, the Clancy Brothers and Tommy Makem breathed new life into timeless songs including “The Wild Rover” and “Brennan on the Moor.”
