On This Date

1836 – Charles Darwin returned to England after his five-year voyage aboard the HMS *Beagle*, an adventure that became the basis for *The Origin of the Species*.

1920 – The last baseball triple-header took place in Pittsburgh. The Cincinnati Reds beat the Pirates in two of the three games.

1950 – Cartoonist Charles Schulz's comic strip *Peanuts* debuted.

1952 – The Royal Canadian Navy destroyer HMCS *Iroquois* was hit by artillery fire from Korean shore batteries, killing three sailors. They were the only RCN casualties of the Korean War.
