On This Date

1933 – Baseball’s first All-Star Game was played at Chicago’s Comiskey Park. The American League won 4–2, with a home run hit by Babe Ruth.

1934 – In the first opera telecast by the British Broadcasting Corporation, Canadian soprano Sarah Fischer sang excerpts from *Carmen* for 30 minutes.

1942 – Anne Frank’s family was forced to go into hiding in a secret attic apartment behind Otto Frank’s business, where the 13-year-old girl would hide for two years and write her famous diary.

1957 – Althea Gibson became the first Black athlete to win the Wimbledon singles tennis championships.

Dolores Claman (1927–2021) was a Canadian composer and pianist. She is best known for the theme song to *Hockey Night in Canada*, a song often regarded as Canada’s second national anthem, which she composed in 1968. In 2008, Claman sold the song’s rights to a private broadcaster. She also composed “A Place to Stand,” which accompanied the groundbreaking film of the same name at the Ontario pavilion of Expo 67 in Montreal. She and her writing partner and husband, lyricist Richard Morris, composed more than 3,000 commercial jingles in their careers.

Passing Fancy

When setting a table for a dinner party, a centerpiece or flower arrangement might serve as a decoration. During the 16th century, French cuisine often used pies as dinner showpieces known as *entremets*. These were not ordinary pastries, but pies stuffed with live animals such as birds.
