1840 – U.S. Naval officer Charles Wilkes explored 1,500 miles of the Antarctic coastline, establishing that the landmass was in fact a continent. That Antarctic coast is now known as Wilkes Land.

1924 – The first Winter Olympics opened in Chamonix, France. Snow skiing became much more popular as a result.



1963 – Wilson Kettle died of natural causes at the age of 102 in Grand Bay, Newfoundland. (Kettle's mother had lived to the age of 108.) At the time of his death, Kettle held the world record for having had the largest number of living descendants (582).
