1947 – Anthropologist Thor Heyerdahl and his crew of five set out on the *Kon-Tiki*, a balsa wood raft, to prove that Peruvian Indians could have settled in Polynesia. The trip began in Peru and took 101 days to complete. Heyerdahl's best-selling book also became an Academy Award—winning film.



1968 – The rock musical *Hair* opened in New York City. The show was a product of the hippie counterculture revolution of the 1960s, and several of its songs became anthems of the peace movement.

Harper Lee (1926–2016) was an influential American novelist best known for her seminal work *To Kill a Mockingbird* (1960). Lee's debut novel explored themes of racial injustice and morality in the American South, earning her the Pulitzer Prize for Fiction. Despite her early success, Lee chose to live a private life and published only one other book, *Go Set a Watchman*, released in 2015. *To Kill a Mockingbird* has

been adapted for the stage and screen and remains a literary classic, addressing profound social issues and sparking



discussions about race and morality.
