Maria Callas (1923–1977) was an iconic opera singer who is considered



to have one of the greatest voices of the 20th century. Born in Manhattan, New York, to Greek immigrant parents,

the soprano was lauded as *La Divina*, which translates to “The Divine One.” Known as a temperamental, exacting diva, Callas was revered the world over for her superior bel canto technique, sweeping voice, and dramatic flair. Her influence on music was profound. In fact, according to *Opera News*, “Nearly 30 years after her death, she’s still the definition of the diva as artist—and still one of classical music’s best-selling vocalists.”
