1763 – The Treaty of Paris was signed, officially ending the Seven Years' War. The treaty significantly reshaped the boundaries in North America, granting Canada and Florida to Britain and marking the decline of French colonial power.

1841 – Britain passed the Act of Union, uniting Upper and Lower Canada into the United Province of Canada.

2000 – Beloved Canadian horticulturist and author Lois Hole, known as the “Queen of Hugs” for her warmth and approachability, became Alberta’s lieutenant governor.

Happy Birthday!

Leontyne Price, born in 1927, is a renowned soprano singer whose voice was described as “vibrant” and “soaring.” She became the first African American leading artist at New York’s Metropolitan Opera. Born in Mississippi, Price sang in the chorus at her high school and earned extra money by singing at funerals and civic functions. In 1961, she debuted at the Met, performing *Il trovatore*, and received an ovation lasting 42 minutes. Price has earned Kennedy Center Honors and 19 Grammy Awards.
