1965 – Canada held a special ceremony on Parliament Hill in Ottawa to inaugurate its new national flag featuring the iconic red maple leaf. This day marked the end of a heated national debate over Canada's identity, as the maple leaf design replaced the Union Jack-inspired Red Ensign. The new flag symbolized Canada's unity and independence.

1998 – Angel of the North, a towering steel sculpture by artist Antony Gormley, was installed near Gateshead in northern England. The sculpture symbolizes resilience and the region's industrial heritage.

Galileo Galilei (1564–1642) was an

Italian astronomer, engineer, physicist, philosopher, and mathematician who is known as the "father of modern



science." Although Galileo did not invent the telescope, he improved the device and used it to observe celestial bodies. He noted the phases of Venus, rings around Saturn, satellites orbiting Jupiter, and sunspots. He also supported the view that planets revolve around the sun, not Earth. The Vatican considered these views heresy and placed Galileo under house arrest for the last nine years of his life.
