1919 – Four of Hollywood’s biggest stars—Mary Pickford, Douglas Fairbanks, D. W. Griffith, and Charlie Chaplin—joined forces to create United Artists, a company where artists could produce and distribute their own films.



1940 – Glenn Miller and His Orchestra recorded “Tuxedo Junction,” a swing classic that became one of their biggest hits.

1981 – For her extraordinary influence on songwriting and her role in elevating Canadian music on the world stage, Joni Mitchell was inducted into the Canadian Music Hall of Fame. Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau presented Mitchell with the accolade during the Juno Awards ceremony in Toronto’s O’Keefe Centre.

“Tuxedo Junction” was named after a vibrant jazz club in Birmingham, Alabama.

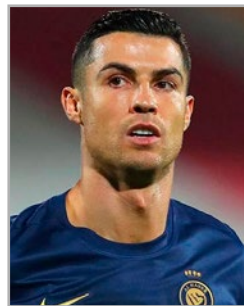
