

Burlap & Buttons Napkin Ring

Create a rustic flower with twine and buttons. Attach the flower to a ring of burlap to hold your Fall dinners.

You will need:

- Paper towel tube
- 2 1/2" X 7" piece of burlap
- Three 2-holed buttons of different sizes (1 1/4", 1", and 1/2")
- 28" length of natural or colored twine
- Glue Dots
- Scissors
- Ruler



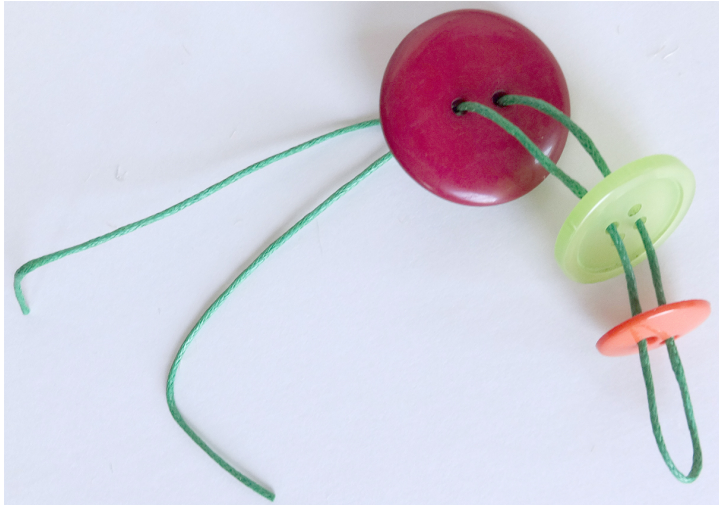
Display a [picture of a completed Burlap & Buttons Napkin Ring](#). Crafters will enjoy making them for their dinner table.

Directions:

1. Cut a 1 1/2" piece off the paper towel tube. Secure the burlap around it using Glue Dots.



2. Place a Glue Dot in the center of the front (seamless) side of the burlap. Cut a 16" piece of twine and wrap it into 6 loops (flower petals), making sure each loop is fixed to the Glue Dot.
3. Fold the remaining 12" piece of twine in half. Pull the ends of the twine through the smallest button first, followed by the middle button, and then finally through the largest button.



4. Place a Glue Dot on the back of the large button and stick it onto the napkin ring in the center of the twine flower.
 5. Wrap the ends of the twine to the back of the napkin ring, tie them securely, and cut off the excess twine.
 6. Pull a cloth napkin through the center of the ring and place it on your Thanksgiving table.
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
