DIY Gift Bows

Cut seven strips of wrapping paper to make a homemade gift bow.

You will need:

- Wrapping paper (or other paper such as scrapbook paper, old maps, newspaper, magazine pages, etc.)
- Stapler
- Double-sided tape
- Scissors
- Ruler
- (Optional) Pinking shears

Print a <u>picture of some completed bows</u> to show crafters. Post a copy on your bulletin board to create interest in the activity.

Directions:

1. Cut seven 3/4"-wide strips of paper—three measuring 10" long, three 9" long, and one 4 1/2" long.



2. Fold the 9" and 10" strips in half and crease to make a center guideline. Then, follow the three steps as shown in the right-hand photo above. Overlap the ends of the strips about 1/4" at the center crease and staple as shown.



- 3. Stack the three 10" strips and staple them together in the center. Repeat for the three 9" strips as shown in the first photo below.
- 4. Stack the group of 9" strips on top of the 10" strips so that the points are alternating. Staple them together in the center or attach with double-sided tape.



- 5. Roll the 4 1/2" strip and secure the ends together with a small piece of double-sided tape.
- 6. Then use another small piece of double-sided tape to stick the small rolled strip of paper in the center of the stacked strips.
- 7. Attach your bow to a gift using a piece of rolled Scotch tape or a piece of double-sided tape.

Variation:

For a different look, cut the strips of paper with pinking shears or decorative-edge scissors as shown in the last photo above.



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
