1787 – Delaware became the first state of the union to ratify the Constitution of the United States.

Larry Bird, born in Indiana in 1956, is a basketball legend and one of the greatest players of all time. He led his Indiana State college team to the NCAA finals against Michigan State and Ervin “Magic” Johnson, only to suffer defeat. Bird joined the Boston Celtics in 1979. He faced off time and again



against his old college nemesis Magic Johnson and the Los Angeles Lakers. Bird became one of the NBA’s best players, earning three MVP awards and winning three championships on his way to entering basketball’s Hall of Fame.
