1874 – The North West Mounted Police built a post in Alberta named after Assistant Commissioner James F. Macleod. The police station, which included a barracks, stables, hospital, and smithy, was made of logs plastered with clay.

1926 – English author A. A. Milne published *Winnie-the-Pooh*. The name *Winnie* was what Milne’s son called a Canadian black bear that he often visited at the London Zoo.

1964 – At age 35, civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr. became the youngest person (at the time) to win the Nobel Peace Prize for his work to end racial discrimination.

Roger Moore (1927–2017) was an English actor. He is most famous for his portrayal of Ian Fleming’s fictional secret agent, James Bond. Moore took over the role from Sean Connery and portrayed Bond in seven different films between 1973 and 1985. A chance run-in with a director paved the way for Moore’s introduction to acting. He also served as a UNICEF Goodwill Ambassador and was knighted by Queen Elizabeth II in 2003 for service to charity.
