

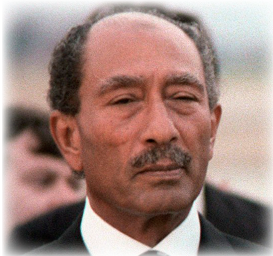

1981 – Egyptian president Anwar Sadat was assassinated at a military rally in Cairo. Extremists were also responsible for 11 other deaths that occurred during the attack.

2015 – Arthur B. McDonald of Kingston, Ontario, won the Nobel Prize in Physics. The Queen's University professor discovered that neutrino particles have mass.

Happy Birthday!

Janet Gaynor (1906–1984) was an actress in film, on stage, and on television. She quickly found fame after signing with the Fox Film Corporation in 1926. Gaynor won the first Academy Award for Best Actress in 1929 for her roles in the silent films *7th Heaven*, *Sunrise*, and *Street Angel*. This was the only time an award was presented for multiple roles. She went on to be nominated for another Best Actress award for her role in the original *A Star Is Born* (1937). After retiring from acting, Gaynor became an accomplished still-life painter.
