

### Eyedropper Daisies

Use an eyedropper to drip watercolor paint onto watercolor paper. Then add flower petals, stems, and leaves with a paintbrush to complete your artwork.

#### You will need:

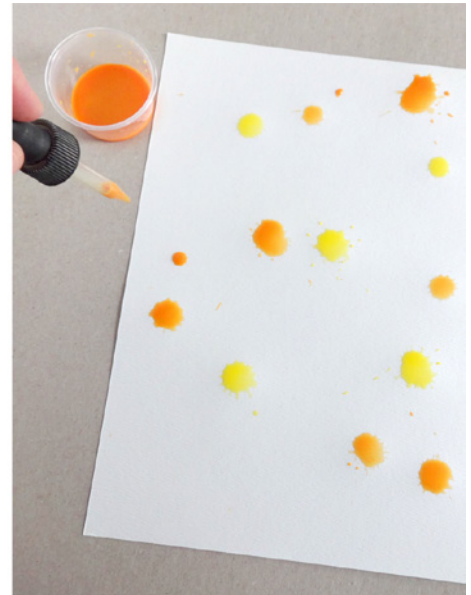
- 9" X 12" watercolor paper
- Watercolor paints
- Eyedropper
- Round, soft-bristled paintbrush
- Cup



Display a picture of a completed [Eyedropper Daisies](#) painting to get artists excited to try this project.

#### Directions:

1. In a small cup, mix about 4 full brushes worth of yellow paint with 6 eyedroppers of water.
2. Fill the eye dropper with the yellow paint mixture. Hold the dropper about 6" above the paper and squeeze 5 to 7 drops of paint across the paper. Add a few eyedroppers of orange paint to the mixture and repeat making 5 to 7 more drops that will become flower centers.



3. While the drops are still wet, begin adding petals with the paintbrush and paint color of your choice. Start from the center and drag the brush outward. Don't worry if the paint colors bleed together a bit—this will make your flowers beautifully unique.



4. Add petals to all the daisy centers, varying colors and stroke size. Overlap some strokes, and, once again, if the paint bleeds a little, it's a wonderful thing!



5. Add green stems, keeping the tip of your brush as pointed as possible. Finish by painting on green leaves as shown in the last photo above.
6. Allow your painting to dry and then sign and frame your May masterpiece.
