## On This Date

**1533** – Anne Boleyn was crowned queen of England. She was the second wife of King Henry VIII and the mother of Queen Elizabeth I.

**1938** – Toronto-born cartoonist Joe Shuster teamed up with Jerry Siegel to create *Superman*. The action hero made his first appearance in DC Comics' Action Comics Series,



issue #1. The cost was 10 cents. A rare copy recently sold at auction for \$317,200.

**1967** – The Beatles released their *Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band* album. The LP was presented as a concert by an Edwardian-era military band and did not include the momentary gaps typically placed between tracks.

**Marilyn Monroe** (1926–1962), originally Norma Jeane Mortenson,



was an iconic movie star and sex symbol of the 1950s until her death in 1962. Monroe, who spent much of her youth in foster homes, was

working in a munitions factory during World War II when a photographer snapped her picture. This song launched her career as a model. Monroe was soon cast in bit film parts and began studying acting. Eventually, the blonde bombshell won praise for her comedic ability in such films as *Gentlemen Prefer Blondes* and *The Seven Year Itch*. She won a Golden Globe for *Some Like It Hot*.

## Eye in the Sky

## Root of the Matter

*Bigger fish to fry*

If you have *bigger fish to fry*, that means that you have other, larger priorities to take care of. The expression dates back at least 400 years, first turning up in print in the diary of John Evelyn, who was writing his memoirs in 1660—around the same time that Samuel Pepys was writing his popular diaries. Pepys frequently wrote about the eating of fish. The idiom entered popular usage and in Peter Motteux's 1703 translation of *Don Quixote*, he used the sentence "I have other fish to fry."
