1889 – A Canadian Pacific train arrived at the port of Saint John, New Brunswick, marking the completion of the railway to the Atlantic coast.

Josephine Baker (1906–1975) was the first African American woman to star in a major motion picture (*Siren of the Tropics*), integrate an American



concert hall, and become a world-famous entertainer. Baker, who found tremendous success in Europe, became a French citizen in 1937. She was a Red Cross nurse and underground courier for the French resistance during World War II. Baker was also active in the American civil rights movement and spoke at the 1963 March on Washington. She adopted 12 children, whom she called her “Rainbow Tribe.”

Only Human

Worldwide, more twins are being born now than at any time in recorded human history. Since 1980, the rate of twin births has increased by 30%. The likeliest reason for this increase is medically assisted reproduction techniques like in vitro fertilization (IVF). But IVF is not the whole story. Another factor is that women are waiting to have children later in life, and older women are more likely to have twins. On the whole, the majority of these twin births are fraternal twins. The rate of identical twin births has remained steady.
