On This Date

1579 – English seaman Francis Drake anchored in a harbor just north of present-day San Francisco and claimed the territory for Queen Elizabeth I. He remained there for a month while preparing for his westward crossing of the Pacific Ocean.

1631 – Mumtaz Mahal died during childbirth. Her husband, the grief-stricken Mughal emperor Shah Jahan I, spent the next 17 years building her mausoleum, the famed Taj Mahal.

1876 – Oglala Sioux and Cheyenne warriors led by Crazy Horse fought U.S. troops to a draw at the Battle of Rosebud Creek. Crazy Horse and his forces went on to join Sitting Bull and defeat General Custer and his men just eight days later at Little Big Horn.

Igor Stravinsky (1882–1971) was a Russian musician and composer, who is often heralded as the most influential composer of the 20th century. In addition to his compositions, he also achieved fame as a pianist and a conductor. His *The Rite of Spring* provoked a riot when it premiered in Paris in 1913 and marked him as being a true innovator. Stravinsky’s rhythm and vitality greatly influenced the composer Aaron Copland. Aside from music, Stravinsky displayed an inexhaustible desire to explore and learn about art and literature.

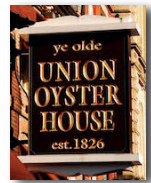
