He is a devotee of meditation and an avid soccer fan. He has five children and has been married to Nancy Shevell since 2011.

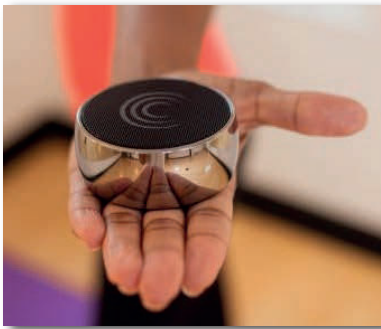
