1620 – Samuel de Champlain began construction of Fort St. Louis. It was the first fort built on the cliff at Quebec and was designed to protect travelers on the river from attacks by the Iroquois.

Gregor Mendel (1822–1884) was a scientist, mathematician, and Augustinian friar from Moravia, which was then a part of the Austrian Empire, in what is now in the Czech Republic. Mendel is heralded as the discoverer of the



laws of heredity and is recognized as the founder of the science of genetics. He made his revolutionary observations while studying how traits (like color and shape) are passed between generations of pea plants that he cross-bred in various ways. Mendel’s findings revolutionized our understanding of genes.

Household Tips

When cooking a big pot of pasta, you should not leave it to boil without being watched. Starch molecules from the pasta enter the water and turn to foam, which can expand, rise, and eventually boil over. To avoid boiling over, one trick is to leave the lid off the pot. The hotter the pot, the faster the starch molecules heat up, and the faster the foam rises. A lidless pot will dissipate heat. Or you could lay a wooden spoon across the top of the pot.
