

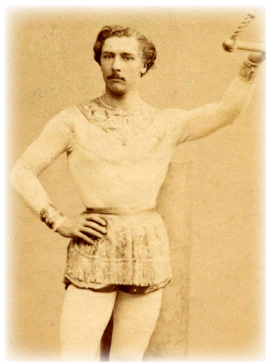

1859 – Jules Léotard made his first public appearance as a flying trapeze artist in Paris. Just 21 years



old, he practiced by swinging from a trapeze over his father's swimming pool. He is also known for designing the garment that is named after him.

1926 – Alma Heflin, the first female test pilot for production aircraft, made her inaugural test flight for the Piper Aircraft Corporation.

1951 – The National Ballet of Canada gave its debut performance in Toronto. The ensemble is one of the premier classical ballet companies in Canada.

Grace Kelly (1929–1982) made her film debut in *Fourteen Hours* (1951). She went on to star in other major films: *High Noon* (1952) with Gary Cooper, *Dial M for Murder* (1954) with Ray Milland, *Rear Window* (1954) opposite Jimmy Stewart, and *To Catch a Thief* (1955) with Cary Grant. She gave up all these leading men to marry Prince Rainier Grimaldi of Monaco, with whom she had three children: Caroline, Albert, and Stéphanie.
