On This Date

1921 – *Little Lord Fauntleroy*, starring Toronto actress Mary Pickford, was released.

1930 – The Rotolactor first went into operation. The revolving platform milked 1,680 cows in seven hours by rotating them into position with the milking machines. In the dairy industry, it is known as the “rotary milking parlor.”

1981 – The first Canadarm remote manipulator performed flawlessly in four hours of tests on the Space Shuttle *Columbia*. Canadarms were used on many shuttle missions. One of them is now on permanent display at the Canada Aviation and Space Museum in Ottawa.

1982 – The Vietnam Veterans Memorial was unveiled in Washington, D.C.

Happy Birthday!

Robert Louis Stevenson (1850–1894), author of *Treasure Island*, was one of the most-read writers of the late 1800s. Thought to have suffered



from tuberculosis, he spent many years traveling in search of a climate that would alleviate his illness.

He finally settled in Samoa, where he adopted the name *Tusitala* (“teller of tales”). The Samoans admired him, and the engraving on his tombstone was translated to a Samoan song of grief.
