1863 – President Abraham Lincoln delivered his Gettysburg Address. The short speech redefined the Civil War as a struggle not just for the Union but also for the principle of human equality.

1928 – After five years of publication, *TIME* magazine presented a color cover portrait for the first time. The cover featured Japanese Emperor Hirohito.

1959 – The Ford Motor Company announced the discontinuation of the unpopular Edsel. Although a flop at the time, the car is now a rare collector's item.
