Individuals, Family and Care Givers Approach

Health care providers delivering care and support to persons with ASOD and their families will have the knowledge, skills and abilities to provide holistic person-centered care

Alzheimer Society of Nova Scotia is recognized as a partner in dementia research, providing collaboration, support and funding.

ASNS will continue to advocate to government as they create public policy so that ADOD is seen as a significant health priority.
