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EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

This has been a very exciting year for our organization; most notably with the opportunity to return to in person programming. For the last two years our organization was in reactive mode, learning to navigate unprecedented times, and overcoming challenges that COVID placed upon us. This year however, brought a beautiful break in the clouds; we returned to in person programming, continued building virtual programming, seen significant growth in our adult day programs, BSO Transitional Supports and Recreation Therapy. Our staff have adapted and flourished in a hybrid model of care encompassing both in person and virtual services to ensure our clients are able to access the supports they require to navigate the dementia journey.

Our Adult Day Programs have not only grown in both Sudbury and North Bay, but we are pleased to say we are servicing clients in numerous smaller communities with outreach adult day programs, including Powassan, Mattawa, Sturgeon Falls, Alban, Noelville, Espanola and Hanmer.

Our Recreation Therapy program continues to prove itself a valuable asset. Providing instrumental cognitive, social, and physical stimulation for clients unable to access programming outside of their homes. This design of person-centered respite not only assists persons living with dementia but their care partners as well.

This year we piloted a partnering program called (HISP) High Intensity Support Program with Behaviour Support Ontario. This program is designed to support persons living with dementia in transition to long term care, hospital, and community. We have successfully hired staff in each community we serve to provide this valuable service. I am pleased to say it has demonstrated great benefits and will continue.

I am proud to share that our organization was invited to speak at Parliament Hill in regard to a Renewed Dementia Strategy. I, along with the CEO of Alzheimer Society of Ontario presented a detailed report containing 56 policy and 21 funding recommendations that can serve as a roadmap towards this strategy. This was an amazing opportunity to advocate for future dementia care.

I want to personally express my gratitude to the staff and board of directors for their support over the past year. I feel grateful for the opportunity to lead a dedicated, innovative, and resourceful team that focuses on best practices in dementia care. They are driven, committed and always go above and beyond to support those in our community who require services, education, system navigation and advocacy.

PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

As the Société Alzheimer Society Sudbury-Manitoulin North Bay & Districts entered its second year of the pandemic and transitioned to a new normal, our dedicated team continued to offer best possible support services and programs for persons living with dementia, their care partners and more. While staff continued to find innovative ways to navigate the pandemic, the Board of Directors embarked on risk management and strategic planning exercises.

With the proper COVID-19 protocols in place, the Society was able to resume and even expand in-person services such as the adult day programs, recreation therapy and health promotion. The Board reviewed and approved policies to enable the

Society to provide face-to-face services while mitigating risks and ensuring all health and safety measures were in place.

The Board hired a consultant to provide refresher training regarding its governance responsibilities and to help develop a risk management dashboard for the organization; this work will be instrumental as the Society moves towards accreditation. At the provincial level, we participated in the development of a common strategic framework (2022-2025) for the federated Alzheimer societies in Ontario, from which we will draw for our next planning cycle.

Our Society also contributed to the Alzheimer Society of Ontario's Roadmap Towards a Renewed Ontario Dementia Strategy, with our Executive Director, Stéphanie Leclair, representing Alzheimer Societies across the province as the French Language presenter at Queen's Park on April 18, 2022. Shortly after, the provincial government announced a three-year commitment of \$15 million towards a renewed Dementia Strategy in its 2022 budget. This is exciting news for Alzheimer societies across the province, but especially for those living the dementia journey.

As we look forward to increased funding and support for dementia care, I take this opportunity to thank Stéphanie and the entire team for another exceptional year of dedication to the people of our districts who rely on our programs and services. You have continued to weather the COVID storm with grace, courage, and unwavering commitment. I would also like to thank my fellow Board members for their leadership, expertise, and passion in ensuring that our organization is accountable and forward-thinking.

FRENCH LANGUAGE SERVICE COMMITTEE

Bonjour,

Thank you for giving me the opportunity to share the highlights of the French Language Services (FLS) Committee activities for 2021-2022.

Despite another persistent year of pandemic, the Committee continued to meet as usual. Meetings were maintained virtually and quarterly to ensure that the Society met its obligations as a designated agency under the French Language Services Act, providing quality French language services to its vulnerable clients being served, their families and caregivers.

A new Action Plan for 2021-2022 was developed which included French language training for three additional employees, dementia education sessions in French such as the Learning series program and presentations offered to the public and care givers. The Society also entered into a new partnership for health promotion activites for Francophones with Western University to deliver the program Minds in Motion virtually throughout the province.

The Committee revised as planned, the organization's FLS policy and terms of reference in 2021. Membership was increased to welcome a staff member from the Sudbury-Manitoulin to join the Committee and bring a new perspective to the group.

The Society met its FLS reporting obligations to the Ministry of Health and responded to requests for additional information from Ontario Health North while benefiting from the support of the Réseau du mieux-être francophone du Nord de l'Ontario.

In the coming year, the Committee will continue to implement the strategies included in its ongoing action plan to maintain and improve French language services for Francophone clients living with dementia and their care partners.

INVESTOR COMMITTEE

The Investment portfolio that we placed with Connor, Clark and Lund have been invested now for just over a year (January 2021). The portfolio that we chose is diversified within a Benchmark of 5% FTSE Canada 91-day T-bill Index & 45% FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index & 25% S&P/TSX Composite Index & 25% MSCI World ex-Cda Index (C\$). The one year rate of return is sitting at 5.2% and the value to the end of March 31, 2022 is \$1,125,626.

As we have seen, there is a lot of turmoil in the markets and by diversifying our portfolio over a number of Asset Classes, we are actually reducing our overall risk. The returns received have proved much more lucrative than the monies just sitting in a bank account. We will have a good base in which to choose how we will use these funds in the future.

We continue to receive quarterly updates as well communications on market conditions as well as invitations to various webinars. We can also request a full board update if required.

Performance returns and will continue to be monitored on a regular basis. The Investment Committee is confident in the current portfolio strategy and is pleased with the growth of the portfolio to date.




